Saturday Community Lunch Program

Park Avenue Christian Church's Saturday Community Lunch Program (SCLP)— is a thirty year ecumenical ministry to serve those in need of fellowship and a meal from the five boroughs of New York City. It is *The Park*'s signature Outreach Ministry and is composed of congregations from *The Park*, The Temple of Universal Judaism, Manhattan Church of Christ and Park Avenue United Methodist Church and formerly St. Ignatius Loyola RC Church.

Faced with the challenge of keeping this essential Outreach Ministry running at The Park presently, on the first and fifth Saturday of the month serves Bag Lunches prepared and distributed from the Park's 85th Street entrance. On the second and fourth Saturdays Manhattan Church of Christ has graciously opened its doors so we can prepare and serve sit-down lunches so our guest can experience the warmth and fellowship they have experienced over the years.

While meals are being prepared there is a Bible Study and motivational film after lunch. On the third Saturday we recommend our guests to go to St. Jean Baptiste RC Church.

Since my tenure we have opened up the pool of volunteers to incorporate Little Sisters, Youth Opportunity Program, the Leos and Lions Clubs, students from our neighbor's schools e.g. St. Regis, Loyola, etc. Undergrads from the City University of New York's Baruch College, Hunter College, John Jay College, and the Borough of Manhattan Community College. Youth groups and members from Disciple of Christ Churches in the Metro Area and NE Region to name a few. I have also been allowed by the NYC Court System to have minor offenders comply with their Community Service judgments at the SCLP.

We have also expanded this Ministry to incorporate Free Flu Shots for SCLP guests and the community-at-large for the past two years working with pharmacist Lilly Leung and the Duane Reade/Walgreen organization. This past year's *Get a Shot/ Give a Shot* also included a vaccine being donated to individuals in Latin America and Africa for each shot taken at the SCLP.

Mission Update by Rev. Hugo Monroy, Chair



The church exists in order to carry out the mission of God. That mission has to do with the liberation of human beings from the oppression of sin, Satan and world. We at the Park have several opportunities for members to join the Lord in his mission of redeeming his creation. You can contribute to the wells in Haiti, you can volunteer at an immigration clinic, or at

a homeless luncheon, you can even lead your own ministry in an area where you feel call by God to make a difference or in an area you are very passionate about.

Concerning the immigration clinics: we do them because the immigrant has a preferential option in the sight of God. The Lord commanded Israel to treat the immigrant among them well, remembering that they were immigrants in the Land of Egypt, Deuteronomy 14:28-29; 16:11; 24:19. Abraham recognized that he was an immigrant in the land of the Hittites, Genesis 23:4; most of our ancestors in the faith, regardless of where they lived, recognized they were resident aliens on this earth, Hebrews 11:13. The Lord also told Israel not to sell the Land, because the land is His and we all are mere tenants, Leviticus 25:23. Our Lord himself and his family were exiles to Egypt and they were immigrants. We do the clinics four times a year. We average about 15 families per clinic. We volunteer between 3-31/2 hours each time. We just had our second clinic this year on March 7, our next clinic is going to be on June 6. We normally start at 9 am and go until about noon, or 12:30.

On Sunday, March 15th, we welcomed Paul Turner who will be serving as a missionary and Disciple Ambassador in the Democratic Republic of Congo for the next four years. We look forward to supporting the ministry and work of Paul Turner with our sisters and brothers in the Congo. For more information visit

Katrina B. Mitchell, MD, a member of *The Park* since 2011, works as a general surgeon at Sekou Toure Regional Referral hospital in Tanzania, East Africa. A 2014 graduate of the Weill Cornell-New York Presbyterian Hospital general surgery program and a 2006 graduate of Dartmouth Medical School, Katrina has been involved with global health outreach activities for most of her medical education and career. She previously lived in Tanzania from 2009-2012, when she helped develop surgical education for the local medical school and established the first pediatric burn unit for the northwestern Tanzania Lake Zone region.

Currently, Katrina treats a variety of emergency and elective surgical conditions and is collaborating with local colleagues to expand the burn unit's prevention and outreach initiatives among rural villages. In the

summer of 2015, Katrina will return to the US to complete a one-year breast surgical oncology fellowship at MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston, Texas. As a surgeon, who will focus specifically on breast cancer operations, Katrina's goal is to work with breast cancer patients from underserved populations both in the US and abroad. She ultimately would like to improve breast cancer care for all patients, regardless of race or socioeconomic status.

Throughout her life as a physician, Katrina often remembers I Peter 4:10-11: Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received. Whoever speaks must do so as one speaking the very words of God; whoever serves must do so with the strength that God supplies, so that God may be glorified in all things through Jesus Christ. To him belong the glory and the power forever and ever. Amen.

Our Journey to Such a Time as This



At every intersection of one's life many different roads traveled with many different guides and co-travelers converge, creating a uniquely individual yet communal experience. It is a moment when one's past pursuits and dreams have carried you to this point but your future is calling you to take the key kernels of those lessons and forge a new unpaved path using these kernels as tools to help you along the way. Such a mo-

ment in my life will be occurring on April 26th, 2015 when I will be ordained by the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ) and Park Avenue Christian Church.

Born in New Braunfels, Texas and raised in Yukon, Oklahoma, my life's journey has included taking several different paths. Beginning with sports, moving along to the theatrical stage and meandering into the non-profit social justice world, this path has been a varied one. However, along these varied paths, there was a constant restlessness in my being, a longing to find my calling.

Growing up the son of a Presbyterian pastor, I was consistently knocking down the vicious assumption that I would be attending seminary. However, God's plans have a funny way of being revealed. After putting up a losing fight for many years, I entered Union Theological Seminary in 2010. Union was a precious place for me. In conjunction with being in a local church community, it is where I was able to form my theological framework and lens that finally led me to seek ordination with the Disciples of Christ.

Many people have guided me on my journey and helped to create this current path. None of whom are more important than my wife, Bianca.

A trained dancer and singer, we met working in a popular Times Square restaurant. Somehow, between her different tours of Asia and the United States, we stayed in touch, fell in love and on May 20th, 2012 we were married.

Bianca, who is now working in real estate, has been a grounding force in my life. It was a shock to her system when I told her I wanted to go to seminary and an even bigger shock when I told her I wanted to be a pastor. But her support has never wavered and even gotten stronger as this moment has gotten closer. This bond will



be even more important as we embark on this new journey together while also anticipating the birth of our first daughter in June. This journey into ordained ministry will be new on several different fronts.

It is with utmost humility, thankfulness and eagerness that I am being ordained as a servant and a disciple of Christ. I can't thank members of The Park enough for their continued support.

We acknowledge that your responses have enabled us to understand that different individuals bring different talents and expressions to the

music that lifts our spirits every Sunday.
